FEDERAL SUIT TO GET VAST TRACT.

Government to Prevent use of New Mexico Lands.

Petition Alleges Fictitious Names Were Used to Acquire. Holdings.

The United States Government has filed suit at Alamogordo for the recovery of the timber lands of the Alamogordo Lumber Company. The government has entered a similar suit against the Pensylvania Development Company of Albuquerque, which operates extensive tracts of timber land situated in the Manzauo Mountains. It is stated that more than \$500,000 are involved in the two suits. The Alamogordo Lumber Company is a subsidiary concern of the Phelps-Dodge Company the Eastern syndicate which owns the El Paso and Southwestern Railroad and the coal fiel of Dawson, N. M., as well as large mining and smelting interests in Arizona and Mexico.

Some novel points are at issue in the two suits. The lumber interests throughout the West will be interested in the outcome, as many of them occupy the, same position as the two defendant companies in the matter of acquiring their lands. The petition in the case against the Alamogordo Lumber Company is voluminous, and is signed by Ormsby McHarg and Peyton torney general of the United States.
